#### Worship During the Week –

- Morning Prayer is offered each weekday morning at 8:30AM. Evening Prayer is offered on Wednesdays at 4:00PM. Each service lasts 15-20 minutes and includes readings from scripture, silence, and intercessions.
- Holy Eucharist is offered each Wednesday at 12:00PM in the Church. Prayers for Healing, along with Laying on of Hands and Anointing is offered on the third Wednesday of each month.

**Shrove Tuesday Supper** – Tuesday, February 17, 5:30PM – Join us for a feast before the fast! A Cajun-themed supper will be offered by our Men's Breakfast group on Shrove Tuesday evening. All are welcome and invited!

**Ash Wednesday** – Our Lenten journey begins with worship throughout the day – Holy Eucharist with Imposition of Ashes will be offered at 7:00AM, 12:00PM, and 6:00PM. Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer will also be offered on this day, at 8:30AM and 4:00PM, respectively.

**The Listening Post at App State** - The Listening Post, a campus ministry sponsored by Presbyterian Episcopal Campus Ministry, is seeking volunteers for the Spring Semester.
