SUNDAY MORNING CHRISTIAN FORMATION OFFERINGS

- **Rector's Forum** In Rector's Forum this morning, we continue a five-week study of the rituals and practices surrounding Holy Week with a closer look at Maundy Thursday. This is the first liturgy of the *Paschal Triduum*, the great three days of our Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Maundy Thursday is a day of multiple themes, the call to love and service of one another and the institution of the Eucharist. Join us in the Barrett Room at 9:00AM as we continue our study of the ways in which we worship during Holy Week.
- **Godly Play** This morning in the St. Luke room, Godly Play will be offered for children of all ages as we prepare to enter the Mystery of Easter. This week we'll learn about the 40 days and 40 nights Jesus spent in the desert and what he discovered
