SUNDAY MORNING CHRISTIAN FORMATION OFFERINGS

- **Rector's Forum** In this morning's Rector's Forum, we conclude our five-week study of the rituals and practices surrounding Holy Week with a look at the liturgies for Holy Saturday and the Great Vigil of Easter. The first is a simple gathering to contemplate absence and linger with the reality of Jesus in the tomb. The latter is a joyful celebration including fire and light, scripture and song, baptism and eucharist to proclaim with joy the Good News of life overcoming death in Christ's resurrection. Our conversation begins at 9:00AM in the Barrett Room. All are welcome!
- **Godly Play** This morning in the St. Luke room, Godly Play will be offered for children of all ages as we prepare to enter the Mystery of Easter.

CHORAL EVENSONG - This afternoon at 3:00PM, the choir will lead Choral Evensong. Join us as we close the day with scripture, song, and silence. All are welcome!
