

During the season of Lent, I want to invite us to read together the book, *Hanging by a Thread: The Questions of the Cross*, written by Samuel Wells, Vicar of the Parish of St. Martin in the Fields, London, and former Dean of the Duke University Chapel. Wells invites us to go deeper into the mystery and paradox of the cross, setting

aside easy conclusions and daring to sit in the discomfort of sin, brokenness, and death that Jesus' crucifixion exposes. In the discomfort, he suggests, we uncover the deep meaning that the cross offers our lives and our faith.

Feast Days in March


The Feast of St. Joseph will be observed on Saturday, March 19th at 9:00 AM.
