A hidden gem of our *Book of Common Prayer*, these words are located in the rites for the Ministration to the Sick. Intended for use by one who is ill, this prayer for the morning feels appropriate for any time, but especially for our present moment.

This is another day, O Lord. I know not what it will bring forth, but make me ready, Lord, for whatever it may be. If I am to stand up, help me to stand bravely. If I am to sit still, help me to sit quietly. If I am to lie low, help me to do it patiently. And if I am to do nothing, let me do it gallantly. Make these words more than words, and give me the Spirit of Jesus. Amen.

At this time, we do not know when 'normal' will return, and whatever normal emerges will, no doubt, be different from what we knew before, shaped by the experiences of these months. So, then, let us pray for today, for the wisdom and courage to be who God made us to be and to follow in the way God calls us to live, ever with the Spirit of Jesus.

Many of you were able to experience this deeply spiritual and joyous occasion through your computers and TV sets from home. That evening we celebrated the new ministry of our already much beloved new rector, Fr. Andrew, whose ministry at St. Mary's began just a little more than a year ago on June 5, 2019. Tour of Homes Blowing Rock Gala - Moving Forward Cautiously

Although the Tour of Homes was postponed until next year, our Executive committee has been busy planning and hoping that a *SAFE* Gala can be held on Thursday, September 24th at the Blowing Rock Country Club from 5:30 until 8:00 pm. Plans include a live auction, dancing (at an appropriate distance) and music provided by The Lucky Strikes Orchestra.

The committee has been thrilled with our response to date as sponsorship opportunities have been actively pursued only the last couple of weeks. More than \$50,000 has already been raised for community organizations which has been the catalyst for the committee to move forward as these organizations need our support more than ever.

An enormous amount of time has been spent with Club Management and others to discuss how other events are being held safely that are in compliance with State and Diocese guidelines and that others feel comfortable attending. We can have up to 88 guests on the main floor of the club with required social distancing. Masks must be worn at all times except when guests are seated at their table. Upon arrival, guests are escorted to their assigned table and all food and beverages are served by staff. Further, larger tables are used to seat fewer guests at a safe distance from others.

As you know, The Tour of Homes Blowing Rock and Gala supports area organizations and 100% of money raised is given back to our community. Through a grant process, proceeds help feed the hungry, clothe those in need, provide shelter, offer educational resources, fund safe havens for battered women, support the Latino population, promote continual learning and more. Today, organizations are experiencing tremendous strain as they respond to the needs of our community during the Covid-19 crisis and will, in all likelihood, continue to struggle to meet demands due to economic hardships affecting populations served. Last year, \$85,620 was given back to our community.

In light of the uncertainty this year, Evites will be sent approximately one month ahead of the Gala since space will be limited. Also, the committee was thrilled to receive a grant from the Diocese to produce a virtual tour featuring one of the most beautiful homes in Blowing Rock and our committee is deeply grateful to the homeowners for their generous spirit in opening their home to us. All costs involved with filming, editing and creating the access to the virtual tour are covered by this grant. We are in the process of final editing and hope this will inspire viewers to donate to our outreach program.

Our executive committee has spent an enormous amount of time on this and have an incredible desire to move forward with raising as much as possible in this difficult year. BREAD OF LIFE REPORT FOR PARISH ~ JULY 2020



Six teams of men and women from St. Mary's and the Blowing Rock community provide the evening meal one night per month (per team) for residents and neighbors of the Hospitality House in Boone.

The mission of Hospitality House is to rebuild lives and to strengthen the community by providing a safe, nurturing, healthy environment in which individuals and families experiencing homelessness and poverty-related crises are equipped to become self-sufficient and productive.

It serves as the only 24 hour shelter servicing Watauga and six other neighboring counties.

In the past twelve months, members of the Bread of Life teams have prepared and served approximately 6000 meals to the men, women and children at this facility. Some people who no longer liver at Hospitality House come back on the nights that a team from St. Mary's is serving because of the good food and the warm smiles. For the past few months, due to the COVID outbreak, the teams have contracted out to local restaurants to prepare and deliver the evening meals. Despite the pandemic, the residents and neighbors continue to come to be fed.

All involved in this outreach program feel that they take home much more than they give. We all look forward to the day we can prepare and serve dinners again in the kitchen of Hospitality House.


